Learning Together Mission

Learning Together's Mission is to meet the developmental, educational, and health needs of young children of all abilities.

Learning Together Vision

Learning Together's vision is to create a Community of Promise, where children of all abilities are able to reach their full potential with the support of their community and families.

The Leaders in Learning Campaign has the potential to support 99 students in the new school year. For every \$1,000 raised, the expenses to ensure student readiness and preparation for a single child at Learning Together in the new school year are covered, including:

- ◆ Facility and classroom preparation
- ◆ Classroom materials and supplies
- ◆ Health supplies (Kleenex, Clorox wipes, diapers and wipes, etc.)
- ◆ Administrative support
- ◆ Food for healthy meals (breakfast and lunch) and snacks
- ◆ Teacher training and curriculum review
- ◆ Therapy preparation

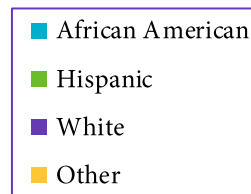
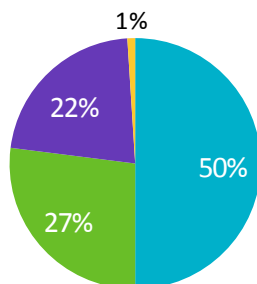
