



Daisy Classroom



Learning Together's Daisy classroom is filled with up to 10 children, ages 3 to 5, who are ready to learn and grow with the world around them. This Structured Teaching Classroom is designed to work with children who have needs that require systematic designed instruction, provided with a low student/teacher ratio in a small classroom setting.

Children attending the Daisy classroom need a structured educational setting with daily classroom routines and expectations. In a language rich environment, children will have multiple opportunities to engage in social exchanges, and practice communication skills and learning activities with peers with adult facilitation. This classroom setting enables Children to benefit from repetition, modeling, and practice of age appropriate skills and behaviors in order to be successful in their educational setting.

The goal of our structured teaching Daisy classroom is to enroll children that need additional supports, provide them with a structured environment and therapies so that they reach their full potential. Children enrolled have opportunities throughout their school day to participate in inclusive activities on the playground, in the cafeteria, and special events with their typically developing peers.

Children in the Daisy classroom receive support services including Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Physical Therapy. These services are provided either directly or through teacher support, where therapists consult with our teachers, giving them the tools needed to help implement goals within the classroom setting. Our Teachers are also trained to work with families, offering resources and guidance needed through the early years.

As each child in the Daisy classroom is faced with unique needs, working one-on-one with a therapist, and receiving an education in a small and structured classroom with teachers who are able to give individualized attention, helps students achieve their specific goals and puts them on the way to achieving their full potential.

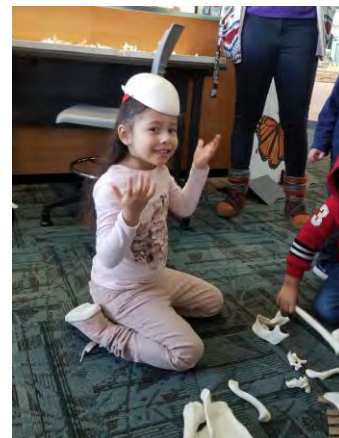
