



Sunflower Classroom



The children in the Sunflower classroom are as sweet as can be! This class consists of 18 children from 3 to 5 years old, with most transitioning into Kindergarten at the end of the school year. Upon entering the Sunflower classroom you will be greeted with lots of hugs and an eagerness to sit and read stories. This inclusive classroom has children both with and without delays working and playing side by side, learning from each other every day.

Learning Centers throughout the classroom promote development of the whole child, including literacy, mathematics, early learning, language, physical and social/emotional development Learning Together places an emphasis on the importance of play as an instructional strategy that promotes learning in early childhood.

For these children, each day brings the opportunity for new achievements and helps prepare them for success. All children have an individualized plan, designed to give them the support needed to achieve their highest potential. Data is collected weekly by the Sunflower teaching team to track progress towards all areas of development including literacy, mathematics, early learning, language, physical, and social/emotional development.

For children with Developmental Delays, support services include Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Physical Therapy. These services are provided either directly or through teacher support, where therapists consult with our teachers, giving them the tools needed to help implement goals within the classroom setting. Our Teachers are also trained to work with families, offering resources and guidance needed through the early years.
